Rising Glory Farm is proud to announce 2008 Mark Russell Clinics. These educational clinics are being offered to trainers and riders of all levels. Auditors are welcomed and encouraged to attend.

Mark Russell Clinics will be hosted at Rising Glory Farm quarterly throughout the year. These two day clinics will have eight (8) private lessons each day, scheduled in one-hour increments.

The 2008 clinic dates are: January 26 & 27; April 19 & 20; July 19 & 20; October 18 & 19.

Rising Glory Farm's teaching facility houses an indoor and outdoor arena, an heated/air-conditioned ranch room for meals and lecture presentations. The facility is located fifty miles south of Nashville, TN in Lewisburg. Day and overnight stalling is available for clinic attendees.

All clinic participants receive:

- One hour one on one private lesson with Mark Russell
- Use of cross ties, grooming area
- Use of Hot/Cold water wash racks
- Riding access to 150' x 250' outdoor arena
- Riding access to 40 acres of pasture and wood trails
- Auditing of other participants private lessons.

Mark Russell began "riding in lightness" after being inspired during a trip to Portugal in 1984 to study under world-renowned Portuguese trainer and rider, Nuno Oliveira. Master Oliveira, like his predecessors in classical riding, believed that enjoyment and success in riding was predicated on first teaching the horse to relax. As the horse relaxes, positive energies are released and the alliance between horse and rider improves. These principles have guided Mark Russell in his pursuit of the artistry and lightness in riding.

Mark blends the benefits of flexion and suppleness first introduced by eighteenth century French classical riding masters Baucher & Robichon de la Guerniere with the late Master Oliveira's concept of relaxation to create a modern day mix that enhances the training methodology found in natural horsemanship techniques practiced today. The proven results of his approach gives the rider a unique opportunity to unleash the horse's true and uncompressed movement without either driving force (the rider's legs) or holding restraints (the rider's hands).

From riding and training Western performance horses in the 1960's through his thirty years of serving Texas, Florida, and New England horse owners with his established training methods, Mark Russell has truly been afforded the time and experience to hone his modern teaching system. His strong and dedicated following of students encompass a wide array of riding disciplines that include Western pleasure riders, hunters, jumpers, dressage, or simple trail riding. Mark Russell continues to share his artistry in lightness by his integration of classical dressage and natural horsemanship principles through his published work, *Lessons in Lightness*.

In 2008, Rising Glory Farm will join Mark's recently acquired Eastern Tennessee horse enthusiasts in exploring the horse's physiological and psychological state as the basis for building that strong bond most riders yearn to achieve in the art of riding.
